



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the Stallion Incentive Program?

The ABHA Stallion Incentive Program is awarded from progeny sired by stallions nominated in the ABHA Stallion Incentive Program.

All proceeds collected from the ABHA Stallion Incentive Program and Stallion Services Auction go towards a bonus at the ABHA National Finals for eligible horses entered in the Futurity, Maturity and Open Divisional.

The highest placed horse in each event listed will determine the winners of the bonus.

How is the money raised?

Stallion owners can either pay their stallion into the program which costs \$350+GST or donate a breeding to their stallion for the ABHA to auction.

There is also a \$55 rider entry fee per eligible progeny to enter the program.

Is this a one off fee or is it paid every year?

Both the Stallion owners and riders must pay in every year.

Is the cost per event at the finals or per horse?

Per horse.

How is the money split?

20% is retained by the ABHA, 40% goes to the riders and 40% goes to the stallion owners. Prize money is divided evenly between three events; Open Divisional, Maturity and Futurity then split 50% to rider and 50% to stallion owner.

For instance, in 2022 Sally Moore won the incentive in the Futurity on 'Bad Azz Morn' who is sired by 'Roc N Morn'. The money was then split between Sally Moore and the owner of 'Roc N Morn'.

Payouts are on the average.

How much money does the ABHA Stallion Incentive raise?

2022 \$31,125.00 33 Stallions

2023 \$36,432.11 41 Stallions

2024 \$44,835.42 39 Stallions

2025 \$52,075.00 41 Stallions



Will the Stallion Incentive pay down the divisions?

Yes, there will be equal payouts in each of the 8 Divisions in the Open Divisional. The Futurity will also have equal payouts in the 1D and 2D. The Maturity is an open event and will pay first plus places. This will depend on how much money is in the prize pool as to how many places are paid out. It will be confirmed closer to the National Finals event.

If I don't win the event/division can I get Stallion Incentive prize money?

Yes, the money will be awarded to the highest place paid-in horse in each event and division. For example, if you place third in the 2D but you are the first progeny paid-in, you will receive first place for that division for the Stallion Incentive payout.

When do entries open/close and how do I enter?

You will enter at the time entries open to the 2026 National Finals. The entry fee is \$55 per horse, not per event. This will be added to the prize money. For example, if you enter the Futurity and Open Divisional you will be eligible in both events but only pay once.
